Supportive Looking - Sit near children and watch play Assessment - Evaluate children's abilities by watching

Non-Directive Statements

Parallel Talk

"You're using the red paint."

"You're working hard."

Description

"The ball bounced high."

"The blocks fell down."

Expansion

Child says, "The nail sticks,"

Teacher says, "The nail sticks to the magnet."

Expansion Plus

Child says, "I got three."

Teacher says, "You have three beads. They are blue."

Questions

Closed - one right answer

"How many blocks are there?"

"What color is this?"

Open-ended - More than one possible answer

Observing - "Tell me about your picture."

Observing Likenesses - "How are these alike?"

Observing Differences - "How are these different?"

Recalling - "Tell me about a time when you did this?"

Ordering - "What do you think happened first?"

"What do you think will happen next?"

Classifying - "What are some other kinds of fruits?"

"What could we call these things?"

Inferring - "Why is he sad?" "How does this work?"

"What will happen if the toys are left on

the floor?"

Making Choices - "Which would you choose?" "Why?"

Predicting - "What will happen when you put this in

the water?"

Directive Statements

Giving Directions - "Pretend you are the patient."
Stating Rules - "Keep the paint on the paper."

Physical Intervention

Modeling - Play game with child. Read book to child. Physical Assist - Help child cut with scissors.
